infectious diseases for Pharm.D., M.S. and Ph.D. students and teaching advanced coursework at the professional, graduate and postdoctoral level. The successful candidate will be responsible for establishing an independent research program in infectious diseases research focused on a combination of laboratory approaches and modeling to advance new strategies to combat bacterial resistance.

Practice or research focus of the position: Infectious Diseases including the following skills: bacterial infectious diseases, pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, pharmacometrics, molecular pharmacology, next generation sequencing in bacterial infectious diseases, genetics, genomics, bioinformatics and modelling approaches to support clinical and translational development of new strategies to combat resistance.

Scholarship and Research Responsibilities:

The faculty member will develop and engage in independent and collaborative scholarly activities in their area of expertise. Collaborative scholarship is strongly encouraged among faculty at UB.

Teaching Responsibilities:

The faculty member will provide didactic teaching in required and elective courses as agreed to with the Chair of the Department of Pharmacy Practice;

Service activities include service to the Department, School, and University (e.g., through active participation on committees), as agreed to with the Chair of the Department of Pharmacy Practice.
